Career Information:

Through the power of live music, Navy musicians forge lasting relationships with audiences worldwide. Our highly experienced professionals serve as diplomatic musical ambassadors who use their talent and skills to inspire patriotism and connect their audiences to the United States Navy.

We present about 6,000 performances annually in the form of public concerts, international and regional tours, parades, educational engagements, TV appearances, and military ceremonies. Our listeners include people from all walks of life such as foreign dignitaries, military officials, and general public spectators.

Performing ensembles in our bands include chamber groups (brass and woodwind quintets), commercial groups (popular music groups, New Orleans-style brass bands, jazz combos/ensembles), classically oriented groups (concert, ceremonial, and parade bands), and more. Our musicians are expected to maintain and showcase their versatility through their ability to perform in many different groups and styles.

The Fleet Bands are located in nine different regions around the world, and as a Fleet Musician, you will begin your career stationed at one of these bands: **San Diego, CA; Silverdale, WA; Great Lakes, IL; Newport, RI; Norfolk, VA; Jacksonville, FL; Pearl Harbor, HI; Yokosuka, Japan; or Naples, Italy.**

Enlisting as a Navy MU opens the door to many benefits and incentives including:

- 30 days paid vacation annually**
- GI Bill and education benefits**
- Lifetime Pension & Healthcare upon Retirement (minimum 20 years of service)**

Auditions for U.S. Navy Fleet Bands are held in Millington, TN on a rolling basis and are determined by projected vacancies. We announce upcoming opportunities on our website, through social media, and on common audition announcement platforms (such as Musical Chairs and Audition Café). It is recommended that candidates audition for the music program prior to enlisting in the Navy.

To be eligible to join Navy Music, a candidate must demonstrate a professional level of performance in their audition and must be able to meet all of the U.S. Navy enlistment eligibility requirements. These requirements include strict height and weight standards in addition to successful completion of a background check and a medical/health screening. Candidates who are not a citizen of the United States must possess a valid green card with no stipulations. The current enlistment age range is 17-41 years old. Waivers are granted on a case-by-case basis and candidates are encouraged to explore their eligibility even if they think they may not qualify. **The Navy does not discriminate against people based on race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or sexual orientation.** One of our greatest strengths is our diverse, inclusive, and equitable culture.

Piano/Keyboard Audition Procedure:

Navy Fleet Bands are seeking versatile musicians capable of playing in a wide range of musical styles at the highest professional standards. Our auditions are designed to reflect the variety of repertoire musicians are likely to perform in our ensembles.

Applicant must bring: Copies of music and backing tracks. U.S. Navy Fleet Bands will provide a keyboard, a small speaker for backing tracks and a PA speaker with XLR and 1/4" inputs for instrument amplification. Applicants may provide their own amplifiers if desired.

To reserve an audition spot, email your applicant fact sheet (enclosed) and one-page resume prior to the application deadline. You are encouraged to contact the Auditions Team with questions or to resolve any scheduling and logistic concerns.

Audition Requirements

Perform selections of your choosing in each style listed below. Selections 1-5 will be performed with a backing track (not provided by U.S. Navy Fleet Bands). Questions regarding song selection should be relayed to the Audition Team.

- 1. Current/Popular (one selection):** any hit song within the last 5 years
- 2. Country (one selection)**
- 3. R&B/Funk/Soul (one selection)**
- 4. Rock/Alternative (one selection)**
- 5. Jazz (two selections):** one swing and one Latin selection.
Each selection should feature 1 chorus playing the head, 1 chorus comping, 1 chorus improvisation.
- 6. Classical (one selection)**
- 7. Feature Selection:** Select a solo of your choosing to demonstrate your strongest individual skills that may or may not have been displayed elsewhere in the audition.
- 8. Real-Time Preparation:** The Audition Panel will provide a listening example of a contemporary pop tune. You will be given 5 minutes to listen to the selection and devise your own keyboard part, which you will be asked to perform after the listening period has elapsed.

Song Selection Considerations

- Prepare keyboard parts as heard on original recordings.
- Account for multiple keyboard parts and solo sections.
- Choose repertoire that demonstrates various techniques.
- Choose repertoire that displays the highest level of proficiency possible.
