Job Description

Integral to the production process, repetiteurs accompany soloists and the chorus in the rehearsal studio and on stage. Repetiteurs possess a specific skills set; they are accomplished pianists with exemplary sight-reading, recreating orchestral timbres on the piano. Repetiteurs pride themselves on their knowledge of the repertoire, their ability to develop strong working relationships, and their understanding of the technicalities of singing for coaching purposes. The position requires individuals who thrive under pressure and demonstrate quick thinking.

Key Accountabilities for Music Staff:

- Play piano at all types of rehearsal
- Play for auditions
- Play keyboard instruments as part of the Orchestra
- Conduct offstage
- Prepare scores including keeping a record of all word changes
- Coach singers
- Monitor vocal standards/give notes to singers
- Undertake work for the ENO Engage & Development departments
- Take part in recordings and broadcasts (subject to the Media Agreement with the Musicians' Union).
- Any other suitable duties relevant to the post
