Gustav Mahler Academy 2025/2026

The Gustav Mahler Academy is one of the leading summer courses in Europe.

Founded by Claudio Abbado to provide outstanding education to young musicians, this two-year course offers a completely unique learning experience focusing on masterclasses, chamber music and orchestra. The Academy's highly acclaimed originalklang project (Year Two), offers modern musicians the rare opportunity to experience the world of period instruments and performance practice. The course is completed by recordings for a major label and appearances in some of the world's most prestigious concert halls.

The Academy includes:

- Masterclasses
- Chamber music and orchestra with musicians from the Mahler Chamber Orchestra
- Symphony orchestra side by side with 50 members of top European Ensembles
- Experience with gut strings and original Viennese instruments from 1900
- Expertise in historic performance practice for late romantic music
- CD recording for Alpha Classics
- European tour to Amsterdam, Hamburg, Paris, Vienna and others. Students receive a fee.
- Full scholarship with room and board

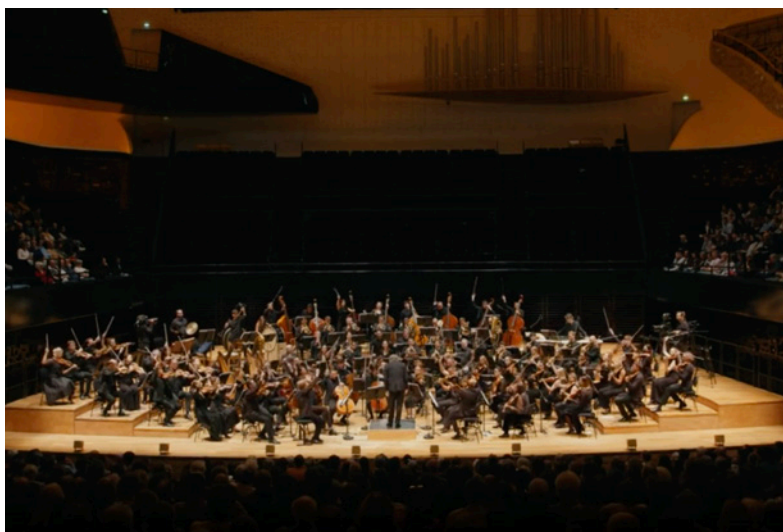

The Academy continues with 50 students of the Mahler Academy and 50 members of outstanding European ensembles forming an orchestra, that has been highly acclaimed by audiences and critics and has caused a sensation during their hugely successful tour in 2024. Playing on period instruments from around 1900, provided by our partner Euregio Kulturzentrum Toblach, the orchestra reconstructs the sound and style of early Viennese modernism and brings a new and revolutionary sound to the Music of Mahler and his contemporaries. No prior period-instrument-experience required!

Gustav Mahler worked with singers all his life and wrote some of his most important works for the human voice. The Mahler Academy Bolzano acknowledges this part of his legacy by adding a course for young singers at the beginning of their careers to its program.

The Mahler Academy for Voice includes:

- Masterclass with soprano Camilla Tilling
- Coaching with pianist Pauliina Tukiainen (professor for Lied at Mozarteum University Salzburg)
- Collaboration with Sir John Eliot Gardiner
- Performances of one or more of Mahler's Rückert Lieder in Bolzano and Dobbiaco with the Mahler Academy Orchestra and Sir John Eliot Gardiner
- Performances of Mahler and Sibelius songs with Pauliina Tukiainen as part of the Academy's chamber music concerts
- Full scholarship including travel, room and board

Applications open: January 13 – February 27, 2025

Requirements

- Participation is open to music students **born between January 1, 1999 and July 21, 2007.**
- All nationalities are eligible for application.
- Applications are open for the following instruments: **violin, viola, cello, double bass, flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, horn, trumpet, trombone and to singers of all voice ranges.**
- Instrumentalists should be enrolled in a conservatory or university. Applications of musicians already under permanent employment cannot be considered. Singers should be in the final semesters of their studies, have recently graduated or be members of an international Opera Studio.
- New and returning applicants are required to submit a link to their audition video. Links to YouTube, Vimeo or similar streaming platforms are welcome, **videos that have to be downloaded will not be considered.** Recordings made with smartphone and/or without piano accompaniment will be admitted. **For the audition repertoire please refer to our website.**
- Participants will be chosen by a **jury of highly respected teachers and performers.** Audition results will be communicated exclusively by e-mail **no later than March 24, 2025.** Results cannot be contested. Due to the high volume of applications the jury will not be able to give individual feedback.
- **Fees:**
 - **Registration fee: €30.00 to be paid at the time of application** (see application form for payment instructions)
 - **Participation fee: €150.00 to be paid upon admission**
- All participants are entitled to an **annual scholarship.**
