COMPETITION

The second international music competition "II. Grunewald International Music Competition" in the former Mendelssohn family palace in the middle of Berlin's Grunewald, idyllically located in a large park, will take place on December 2nd - 21st, 2024.


Open for four string instrument groups - violin, viola, cello & contrabass, divided into two to three age groups, and judged by internationally known and famous musicians. The competition is aimed at young talented musicians from all over the world, and will welcome them to Berlin, Germany

The goals of the competition are to support highly talented young musicians up to the age of 35 on their career path, to enable exchange between young musicians, to establish contact with recognized soloists and professors, to expand musical experiences and to contribute to international understanding. The competition also supports young up-and-coming artists through cash prizes, non-cash prizes and vouchers. Particular emphasis is placed on arranging concert engagements in order to provide the young artists with the best possible support as they start their careers, including a performance with the Geringas Chamber Orchestra in Berlin.

Media partners such as RBB will create an optimal platform for participants through intensive reporting and offer access to a broad public.

The first registration deadline is October 31, 2024.
The last registration deadline is November 15, 2024.

PARTICIPATION RULES

Musicians of all nationalities are welcome to take part in the competition. Participants who have already won 1st prize in our previous competitions may not take part in the same group. The competition is open to the following instruments: violin, viola, cello, contrabass and divided into the following age groups:

Violin:

- I. Group - up to 13 years, born from December 15, 2010
- II. Group - up to 17 years, born from December 15, 2006
- III. Group - up to 32 years, born from December 15, 1991

Viola:

- I. Group - up to 17 years, born from December 08, 2006
- II. Group - up to 35 years, born from December 08, 1988

Auditions in Groups I (viola, contrabass) and in Groups I and II (violin, cello) consist of two rounds:

- I. Round - Solo
- II. Round - Finale, mit Klavier

Violoncello:

- I. Group - up to 13 years, born from December 22, 2010
- II. Group - up to 17 years, born from December 22, 2006
- III. Group - up to 32 years, born from December 22, 1991

Contrabass:

- I. Group - up to 17 years, born from December 08, 2006
- II. Group - up to 35 years, born from December 08, 1988

Auditions in Groups II (viola, contrabass) and in Groups III (violin, cello) consist of three rounds:

- I. Round - Solo
- II. Round - mit Klavier
- III. Round - Finale, mit Klavier

- Participants must appear in person in the relevant category no later than the draw on the first day of the competition and take part in the selection rounds at the times specified in the order determined by the draw. Participants who do not appear will be excluded from the competition.
- The order of auditions will be decided by draw at the opening ceremony.
- The order of the works played can be freely arranged within the round.
- All works except piano sonatas and modern pieces must be performed from memory and without repeat. Individual exceptions must be requested and approved by the competition office. The program registered for the competition cannot be changed after November 15, 2024.
- The piano accompanists will be provided free of charge from the second round onwards.
- The participant has the right to bring a piano accompanist at his own expense.
- The auditions are open to the public and will also be broadcast live on YouTube from the second round.
- The rights to all photos, artist photos, video and audio recordings created during the competition lie exclusively with the competition and its organizer. Participants will receive the photos and videos digitally upon request.
- The prizewinners are obliged to take part in the prizewinners' concert as soloists without fee.
- Jury members evaluate the auditions after each round using a 100-point system for intonation, technique, musicality and artistic expression. The number of points determines the winners.
- The jury has the right to shorten the works, interrupt the performance. The jury's decisions are final and incontestable.
- Participants bear travel and hotel costs.
- The competition office offers accommodation in a 3-stars-hotel and upscale student accommodation including full board directly at the competition location in St. Michaels-Heim Castle with practice opportunities directly in the room (8 AM - 11 PM) and rehearsal opportunities.
- Accommodation in the hotel is possible in single, double and quadruple rooms. Accommodation in the upscale student accommodation is possible in single, double, triple and multi-bed rooms. Accommodation in the castle's hotel and upscale student accommodation can only be booked with full board and for the entire competition period.
- The costs in the hotel starts from €125 per person / night in a quadruple / family room including full board and in the upscale student accommodation from €110 per person / night in a double / multi-bed room including full board:





By completing the online application, applicants submit their application digitally


- a CV
- an artist photo with rights-free publication
- a copy of passport or ID
- list of the works that were selected for the competition with details such as Opus, KV, BWV and an approximate duration. A change is no longer possible after the last application deadline on November 15, 2024
- Payment of the application fee of €195 (online via link) if you apply by October 31, 2024 or €245 if you apply by November 15, 2024. The registration fee for inadmissible participants will be refunded together with the notification of non-admission. No refund of the registration fee will be made for admitted participants, even if they do not appear at the competition for any reason or are absent during the competition.

Registration will only be accepted and considered together with payment of the registration fee. After registering online, you will receive an email with the payment link for paying for accommodation and full board - if this has been booked.

An admissions committee decides on admission to the competition. A maximum of 30 participants per group/instrument will be admitted in the order in which applications are received. In individual cases, the admissions committee may request additional documents from the applicant.

Early application deadlines due to the maximum number of participants reached will be announced on the website and in digital media, such as newsletters or social networks.

The decision on admission to the competition will be communicated by email within 3 days of receipt of the registration. No explanations are given.

CASTLE

The upscale Grunewald district includes the sprawling forest of the same name and a residential area with elegant villas and hotels. On the Teufelsberg, an artificially raised hill made of rubble from the Second World War, guided tours are offered in a listening station from the Cold War era. The Teufelssee and the interactive nature center Ökowerk Berlin are nearby. The Platform 17 memorial in Berlin-Grunewald train station commemorates the Jews who were deported from here on trains.



From 1898 to 1908, Kaiser Wilhelm II's court building officer, Ernst von Ihne, built the building for the banker Franz von Mendelssohn (a great-nephew of Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy) on the corner of Bismarckallee and Herthastraße is an elaborate palace in English country house style. It was a smaller version of Kronberg Castle in the Taunus. Franz von Mendelssohn, later president of the Berlin Chamber of Commerce and Industry, created an atmosphere of tolerance and charity. Wilhelm II frequented his palace, as did Max Planck and Albert Einstein, who played music here in today's Salon Mendelssohn...



The competition office offers accommodation in a 3-stars-hotel and in upscale student accommodation including full board directly at the competition location in St. Michaels-Heim Castle with practice opportunities directly in the room and additional rehearsal opportunities in the castle's practice rooms. Accommodation in the hotel is possible in single, double and quadruple rooms. Accommodation in upscale student accommodation is possible in one-, two-, three- and multi-bed rooms. Accommodation in the castle's hotel and upscale student accommodation can only be booked with full board and for the entire competition period (6/7 nights). The cost in the hotel starts from €125 per person / night in a double / quadruple room including full board and in upscale student accommodation from €110 per person / nights in a double /triple bed room including full board. 
